Subject : Minimum Wages Revision

Hon'ble Sir,

With due respects, all three Associations wish to bring to your notice as under:

1. There have been two revisions of minimum wages in the UT during last six months. This has resulted in severe financial problems to industries. Their costs have gone up and products are becoming expensive. Many units are at verge of closer.
2. The unstable crude oil prices have inflated the problem. Industries are going through a recession. If, special allowance is revised again w.e.f. 01.10.15, it will be last straw of burden, which industries will not be able to carry. Therefore, it is time to look the viability of the industries in the UT and put a moratorium on revision of special allowances / minimum wages for a period of three years to let the industries get stability and come out of recession.
3. Daman Industries Association had submitted a similar representation to DD Administration and they have been assured that no revision in special allowances will be made there by the Administration for next three years. In DNH, the understanding between the Administration and other stake holders during last meeting of minimum wages board, was for parity with the Daman minimum wages. Industries have given their full cooperation and we request Administration to honour the understanding on their part.


If, there is no revision of minimum wages in Daman, than DNH Administration should also not revise.
